

APA 7th Edition Requirements: Basic Formatting and Style

The American Psychological Association (APA) 7th edition:

- Title page (note: A running head is no longer required unless your instructor requires this.)
- 1-inch margins on all sides (see the Layout tab in Microsoft® Word®, select margins on the far left, and then select “Normal”).
- Indent the first line of each paragraph .5 inches.
- Font: Use Times New Roman* 12-point font if none is specified by your instructor.
- Reference page
- Double-spaced
- Left-margin-aligned (see the “Home” paragraph tab in your Word document)
- Include a title page and a reference page in addition to the paper.

References Page:

For every citation in your paper you must have an accompanying reference included on the separate references page at the end of your paper.

*Although there is no specified font and size that is required in the 7th edition of the APA Manual (2020), a sans serif font is suggested in 11-point font size if Ariel or Calibri is used for instance. Alternatively, a serif font such as the one used in this course, or Georgia in 11-point font is suggested (p. 44). Times New Roman 12-point font is the acceptable one to use in this course, unless otherwise stipulated by your instructor.
