DISCUSSION POST:

Hello everyone, my name is John and I live in Pennsylvania, about an hour west of Philadelphia. It's actually a pretty rural area, which is good, because I am the manager at a Christmas tree farm. This is why I am studying business management. I never really thought about using persuasive writing, but now I see that it can be a helpful approach to supporting my business.

One example of effective persuasive writing that comes to mind actually relates to Christmas trees. It was an article written by the president of the state Christmas tree growers trade association and published in the local newspaper. The article was about how people should consider buying a live Christmas tree over an artificial tree. Needless to say, it caught my eye due to the subject matter.

According to the Unit 1 reading "The Rhetorical Situation in College Composition II," using rhetoric can help to advocate for something or to write persuasively to convince our audience. In the case of the Christmas tree article, the rhetorical situation was to persuade the audience to purchase a live tree. The audience would be people who were thinking about buying a Christmas tree. The context might be that people have a choice between buying a natural product and an artificial product. The writer's argument included the fact that real trees are more environmentally friendly because they are not made of plastic, provide homes for wildlife while growing, and can be composted rather than going into a landfill for all eternity. I actually thought the argument was clearly made and very convincing. All in all, this article made use of effective rhetoric described in the Unit 1 reading because it stayed focused on things like audience and purpose.
