HOW TO MASTER THE UNIT 1 PROPOSAL TEMPLATE

WORKING TITLE

The title cannot exceed 12 words in length, contain any abbreviations or words that do not serve a purpose, or words that indicate causation, correlation, or association.

GENERAL PROBLEM STATEMENT

The general problem statement is one sentence that identifies the broad problem. The general problem is viewed at the national level with supporting evidence from credible sources, such as government websites. At least one citation is needed to support your general problem. The paragraph must begin with, "The general problem is..."



MUST CLEARLY ANSWER

What is the problem? Why is it a problem? Where is it a problem?

GOOD EXAMPLES

- The general problem is poor quality of care exists in nursing homes in the United States (DHHS, 2013).
- The general problem is teen pregnancy is prevalent in the United States (CDC, 2016).

POOR EXAMPLES

- The general problem is that all nursing home residents are abused and neglected.
- The general problem is teenagers are having sex before marriage and getting pregnant without thinking about the repercussions and it is causing problems for them to graduate high school and get a job and make it in real life.

HELPFUL TIPS: Do not use absolutes. Do not indicate causation. Do not include more than one problem. Do not hypothesize. Do not include your opinion.

SPECIFIC PROBLEM STATEMENT

The specific problem statement is one sentence that identifies the specific problem. This is accomplished by restating the general problem narrowed down into an identified population, demographic, geographic location, etc.



The specific problem is viewed at the local level with supporting evidence from credible sources, such as local health departments, Medicare compare websites, etc. At least one citation is needed to support your specific problem. The paragraph must begin with, "The specific problem is..."

GOOD EXAMPLES

- The specific problem is poor quality of care exists in nursing homes in Minnesota.
- The specific problem is teen pregnancies are prevalent in Mississippi.

POOR EXAMPLES

- The specific problem is that nursing home residents are being abused physically, mentally, and being financially exploited while living in a nursing home.
- The specific problem is that teenagers are not waiting long enough to have sex which is causing them to get pregnant well before they are capable of taking care of a baby.

PURPOSE STATEMENT

The purpose statement is one sentence that tells the reader the purpose of the research and a few sentences thereafter that asserts the importance of the research. Citations are needed to support your purpose statement.

The purpose statement is an evident action or directive that can yield results (i.e. increase, decrease, improve, develop, eradicate, etc.). The purpose statement is not a generic unidentifiable statement (i.e. to determine, to educate, to see, to find, etc.). The purpose aligns with your specific problem statement. The paragraph must begin with, "The purpose of this research is to..."

HELPFUL TIPS: You can easily identify the purpose of your research by revisiting your original passion for the need to conduct research. If you had a magic wand, what would you do to eliminate the original problem that you identified? This action is your purpose statement.

GOOD EXAMPLES

- The purpose of this research is to increase quality of care for nursing home residents in Minnesota. This is important to research because the population segment aged 65 and older is rapidly aging and will require long-term care (DHHS, 2013).
- The purpose of this research is to reduce the prevalence of teen pregnancies in Mississippi. This is important to research because Mississippi ranks the highest state for teenage pregnancies (Stork, 2012) and teenage pregnancies impact opportunities for adolescents entering the workforce (CDC, 2016).

POOR EXAMPLES

- The purpose of this research is to understand why nursing home abuse continues.
- The purpose of this research is to educate teenagers on abstinence.

RESEARCH QUESTION(S)

The research questions are open-ended questions relative to your general problem or specific problem. The research questions aim to probe the root cause underlying the problem statement. They cannot be easily answered or hypothetical. Label your research questions in numeric order (RQ1, RQ2, RQ3, etc.).



The specific problem is poor quality of care exists in nursing homes in Minnesota.

GOOD EXAMPLES

- RQ1: What initiatives can be developed to improve quality of care among nursing homes in Minnesota?
- RQ2: Why is quality of care substandard in Minnesota compared to other midwestern states?

POOR EXAMPLES

- RQ1: Do nursing homes residents have a voice?
- RQ2: Why do nursing home administrators permit abuse in their facilities?

The specific problem is teen pregnancies are prevalent in Mississippi.

GOOD EXAMPLES

- RQ1: What initiatives can be developed to increase teen pregnancy awareness in Mississippi?
- RQ2: Why is teen pregnancy more prevalent in Mississippi compared to other southeastern states?

POOR EXAMPLES

- RQ1: How are teenage pregnancies happening?
- RQ2: Why don't parents do more to prevent their kids from having sex?

REFERENCES

Include at least five scholarly references. Only scholarly, credible, or peer-reviewed sources will be accepted. You do not need to create a separate page for your references; however, be sure to follow proper formatting techniques with the individual sources in your reference list (i.e. alphabetized, capitalized properly, italicize appropriately, etc.).



ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

You are expected to maintain the University's standards for academic research and professional writing. These are the research, citation, and APA formatting standards outlined in the policy, Writing with Integrity: Expectations for Academic Research and Professional Writing.

At a minimum, students need to adhere to the following standards when developing their capstone research. Please note that students are expected to review the policy for all academic research and professional writing standards, as this is not an all-inclusive list.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- The use of first or second person is prohibited
- Assertions that are not common knowledge must be cited
- Direct quotes should be avoided; however, if one is needed, you are permitted to have one direct quote per 2-3 pages of originally developed content
- Content should be paraphrased and cited (this is different than a direct quote)
- Accidental plagiarism is treated as intentional plagiarism
- The use of previous work is prohibited in your capstone; all content must be developed originally for class
- Double-check for misspellings, grammatical errors, and formatting inaccuracies
